- □ Pack an emergency kit that has food, water, blankets, gloves, warm clothing, flares, a battery-powered radio, a flashlight, back-up batteries, and first-aid gear.
- □ Make sure your reflective clothing is in good shape.
- □ Enable National Weather
 Service alerts on your
 phone. The alerts have
